Dear Parent / Guardian:

We are excited to share an opportunity for Center Grove seniors for 2018-2019. Beginning with this school year, our seniors will be able to earn a Governor's Work Ethic Certificate if they demonstrate work ethic skills and meet other criteria. Earning this certificate is a way for students to demonstrate that they possess the employability and character skills needed to be successful as they enter post-secondary institutions, apprenticeships, the military, and/or the workforce.

Students receiving the Governor's Work Ethic Certificate will be measured in eleven areas of academic and work ethic competency. Six subjective measures (Integrity, Motivation, Professionalism, Adaptability, Communication, and Teamwork) will be evaluated by teachers or other adults confirming that a student has met these requirements. Students must also complete 6 hours of community service, have a GPA of 2.0 or higher, meet all graduation requirements, complete a resume, have an attendance rate of 98%, and have one or fewer discipline referrals for the year.

Central Nine Career Center implemented the Governor's Work Ethic Certification Program at their campus in the 2017-18 school year and is helping our school implement the program as part of a grant they received.

Over the last year, Central Nine Career Center recruited many Business, Community Service and Ambassador Partners who have committed their support to this program and to the students earning the certificate. Based on the feedback we have received from the business community, it is obvious that they place great value on employees who are at work on a regular basis and on time, able to work with others, able to solve problems, and are self-starters.

We would like for you to encourage your student to participate in this program. Students will be able to sign up for the program until September 4, 2018.
