Before moving to Monroe County, she was the academic assistant principal at Brebeuf Jesuit Preparatory School in Indianapolis. She started her career as a science teacher at East Middle School in Martinsville before moving to Fall Creek Valley Middle School in Lawrence Township.

Mrs. Carroll-Frey holds a bachelor's degree in elementary education/general science and a master's degree in education administration, both from Butler University.

She, her husband, David Frey, and two children Megan Frey (8) and Molly Frey (4) are looking forward to moving to the Center Grove area.
